

GERMAN – 1710

The primary purpose of the minor program in German is to guide students through a sequence of integrated courses of instruction toward the acquisition of proficiency in the spoken and written language. Once the basic language courses have been completed, students will have the opportunity to broaden their knowledge of the German-speaking world by the study of the artistic and intellectual aspects of German civilization and by reading selected works of German literature from the Middle Ages to modern times.

Requirements (21 credit hours)

- GER 101 Beginning German I
- GER 102 Beginning German II
- GER 201 Intermediate German I
- GER 202 Intermediate German II

Required for Minor:

- GER 301 German Conversation & Composition
- GER 302 German Conversation & Composition

Students who begin with GER 101 must elect one (1) course within the advanced study area. Students who begin with GER 102 must elect two (2) courses within the advanced study area. Students who begin with GER 201 must elect three (3) courses within the advanced study area. Students who begin with GER 202 or higher must elect four (4) or more courses from the advanced study area for a total of 21 credits.

*Courses in English translation must have the readings done in German, exams and papers must be written in German for credit towards minor.
