

## HISTORY – 1716

The minors in American history and European history are designed to familiarize students with the broad aspects of American or European history while at the same time allowing each student an opportunity to study a particular facet or theme of the respective broad subject. Six hours of designated lower-division courses will provide the student with a general background in American or European history. The twelve-hour requirement of upper-division courses (by advisement) will allow each student to design a sequence of courses which focuses on a particular facet or theme of American or European history (e.g., social, cultural, political, diplomatic, etc.).

A history minor should be especially useful to Applied Science and Education majors who wish to take a thematic sequence of courses in the liberal arts area. Moreover, a minor in history will attract students who are majors in such areas as political science, economics, criminal justice, pre-law, etc. Students interested in public service areas, civil service, and related areas may also find that a history minor can be very useful.
