

ITALIAN – 1711

The minor in Italian is designed to guide students in the acquisition of proficiency in the language as it is spoken and written today. Course materials will focus on various facets of Italian civilization — art, history, customs, and literature — as a basis for language instruction. Upon completion of the basic sequence of language study, students will have the opportunity to read some of the masterpieces of Italian writing, considering their literary aspects, and employing them as a means of further development of language skills.

Students who begin with ITA 101 must elect one (1) course within the advanced study area. Students who begin with ITA 102 must elect two (2) courses within the advanced study area. Students who begin with ITA 201 must elect three (3) courses within the advanced study area. Students who begin with ITA 202 or higher must elect four (4) or more courses from the advanced study area for a total of 21 credits.
