Albert Einstein College of Medicine Minority Students Summer Research Opportunity Program:

June 11th - August 9th, 2007

A fellowship in the amount of \$2,500 will be awarded to students who historically have been underrepresented in medicine, African American, Latino/Hispanic, and Native American. Criteria for selection include an excellent academic record and strong interest in research. MSSROP will provide students with nine weeks of research experience conducted with a faculty member at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine. In addition to research training, students will participate in a special seminar/lecture series together with other college students who are at Einstein for the summer. Our goal is to introduce students to the broad research environment of a major academic medical center as well as to provide training in a specific field of biomedical investigation.

2007 MCEER REU Program and REU Diversity Program:

June 1st - Mid August, 2007

This program will sponsor outstanding junior and senior undergraduates students in civil engineering to spend ten weeks conducting individual research projects in earthquake studies this summer at NSF-funded MCEER-affiliated earthquake research universities. At the end of the summer, the

students will present their research results at a symposium and participate in field trips and other technical activities jointly organized by MCEER, Mid-America Earthquake Center (MAE), George E. Brown, Jr. Network for Earthquake Engineering Simulation (NEES). REU participants will be paired with a faculty advisor and will join the faculty member's research team. Each participant will have a predetermined individual research project, chosen during the selection process, and will be responsible for completing the project within the allotted time.
