WELCOME TO BUFFALO STATE!

We are pleased that you're visiting the campus! We hope this self-guided tour will help you become more familiar with the college.

START AT:

19 Moot Hall

The Registrar's and Financial Aid offices are upstairs; the Admissions Office is downstairs.

✦ Exit Moot Hall and walk northeast to the 3 Donald Savage Theater and Communication Building.

3 Donald Savage Theater and Communication Building

This building is home to theater and broadcasting programs and contains the Flexible Theater, classrooms, and broadcasting studios.

✦ Walk along the north side of 2 Ketchum Hall. As you stand next to Ketchum Hall, notice the quadrangle of space (Rockwell Quad) formed by the four brick buildings: 1 Rockwell, 2 Ketchum, 3 Savage, and 4 Bacon. These are four of the original five Buffalo State buildings completed in 1931.

2 Ketchum Hall

Ketchum Hall houses the Exceptional Education, Speech-Language Pathology, and English departments.

✦ Continue walking east to the front of Rockwell Hall, which faces Elmwood Avenue.

1 Rockwell Hall

Rockwell Hall, with its stately columns and clock tower, is the college's signature building. It features the 850-seat Performing Arts Center and historic Metcalfe Rooms on the main floor. The building also houses the Music and Theater departments, music and dance studios, and more. The Art Conservation Department is located on the second floor, and the Burchfield-Penney Art Center is located on the third floor. Both will soon move to the new Burchfield-Penney Art Center Museum, under construction next door.

✦ Continue to the north side of Rockwell Hall and walk westward along Iroquois Drive. You'll notice a small brick house on your right, 5 Campus House.

5 Campus House

Campus House opened in 1931 as one of the five original campus buildings. For many years it was used as the president's house. In 2000, the building was renovated as a teaching lab for the Hospitality and Tourism Department and a social club for the Buffalo State community.

✦ Head west as you walk back to Rockwell Quad, toward 4 Bacon Hall.

4 Bacon Hall

Bacon Hall houses the Elementary Education and Reading, Educational Foundations, and Student Personnel Administration departments.

✦ Continue west, between 37 Cleveland Hall and 6 E. H. Butler Library. Turn the corner (right) into the Student Union Quad, another campus quadrangle formed by 37 Cleveland Hall, 8A the Campbell Student Union, 24 Bulger Communication Center, and 6 E. H. Butler Library. Enter 6 E. H. Butler Library on your right.

6 E. H. Butler Library

The library currently shelves 530,000 books, more than 900,000 microforms, more than 20,000 audiovisual materials, and full-text articles from more than 20,000 journals. It has almost 200 computers for student use. StudyQuad, a state-of-the-art study facility with extended hours, provides a safe, quiet place for students to work late at night. The library also houses the archives of Buffalo State and numerous special collections, including the archives of the Buffalo Courier-Express, the Tom Fontana Collection, and Seneca Nation Land Claims.

✦ Exit the library and cross the Student Union Quad to the 8A Campbell Student Union.

8A Campbell Student Union

The Campbell Student Union is the center of life on campus. Whether you want to relax between classes or grab a bite to eat, this is the place. The Student Union, home to the Barnes & Noble at Buffalo State Bookstore, houses its own café, food venues, the student-run radio station, study areas with Internet access, and student offices. The building is undergoing a \$7.3 million renovation.

✦ Exit the Student Union the same way you came in (east side), and walk north toward 24 Bulger Communication Center.

24 Bulger Communication Center

This round building houses the larger lecture halls on campus along with smaller classrooms.

✦ To the east of Bulger, you'll see 18 Caudell Hall.

18 Caudell Hall

Caudell Hall contains classrooms, kitchens, and sewing rooms for students in the fashion and textile technology, dietetics, and hospitality administration programs. The Speech-Language-Hearing Clinic is also located in this building.

✦ *Head north, down the steps on the west side of 24 Bulger, toward 7 Upton Hall.*

7 Upton Hall

Upton Hall houses the Fine Arts, Design, and Technology departments. It has two art galleries and is the proud home of Warren Enters Theatre, one of Western New York's premier performance spaces.

✦ *Moving west from Upton, you'll see the 15 Science Building.*

15 Science Building

The Science Building contains the Biology, Chemistry, Earth Sciences and Science Education, and Physics departments. It also houses the Whitworth Ferguson Planetarium, greenhouses, and research space for the Great Lakes Center.

✦ *Follow the sidewalk north to 27 Tower 1.*

27 Tower 1

The Towers are suite-style residence halls for sophomores, juniors, and seniors. Behind Tower 1, you'll see 26 Moore Complex, apartments for upper-division or graduate students and students with children.

✦ *Take the sidewalk around the back (west side) of the Science Building past the greenhouse and walk south to 35 Classroom Building.*

35 Classroom Building

This building houses the Anthropology, Criminal Justice, Economics and Finance, Geography and Planning, History and Social Studies Education, Political Science, Psychology, Social Work, and Sociology departments.

✦ *Head west to the 39 Sports Arena.*

39 Sports Arena

17 Houston Gymnasium

The 70,000-square-foot Sports Complex, home to the NCAA Division III Buffalo State Bengals, comprises the Ice Arena, Houston Gymnasium, Robert Kissinger Memorial Pool, and Sports Arena. Surrounding athletics facilities include Coyer Field, Softball Field, practice fields, an outdoor track, and tennis courts. The Sports Arena has a 3,500-seat basketball arena, indoor track, and Buffalo's only collegiate ice rink. Houston Gym has a state-of-the-art fitness center, free to all Buffalo State undergraduate students. Houston Gym also houses the Health and Wellness Department.

✦ *Retrace your steps eastward, past the Classroom Building again, to 8D Perry Hall.*

8D Perry Hall

This residence hall has corridor-style rooms and is home to more than 200 freshmen.

✦ *Move south to 8C Chase Hall.*

8C Chase Hall

Chase Hall houses the Computer Information Systems, Creative Studies, and Business departments, as well as University Police.

✦ *Northwest of Chase Hall, you'll see 36 Weigel Health Center.*

36 Weigel Health Center

Weigel Health Center provides health and wellness services for all registered students. The Counseling Center is also housed here.

✦ *Head south toward 14 North Wing.*

14 North Wing

13 Twin Rise

12 South Wing

These three buildings, though connected, serve different purposes. North Wing, a residence hall, houses international and honors students. South Wing contains University College and its Academic Advisement Office, Academic Skills Center, All College Honors Program, Center for China Studies, Disability Services Office, Educational Opportunity Program (EOP), International and Exchange Programs, Undergraduate Research Office, and more. Twin Rise is home to Computing and Technology Services.

✦ *Follow the sidewalk eastward to the front entrance of 11 Porter Hall.*

11 Porter Hall

This corridor-style residence hall is home to 400 students and also houses the Residence Life Office.

✦ *Standing in front of Porter Hall, you will see 10 Neumann Hall to the south and 9 Bishop Hall to the north. These three buildings form Porter Quad.*

10 Neumann Hall

Neumann Hall is a corridor-style residence hall that houses more than 200 freshmen.

Bishop Hall houses the Art Education, Communication, Mathematics, Modern and Classical Languages, and Philosophy and Humanities departments.

✦ Continue east, to the traffic circle in front of

37 Cleveland Hall

37 Cleveland Hall

Cleveland Hall contains offices for Alumni Affairs, the Career Development Center, the Graduate School, the Small Business Development Center, and college administration.

On the south side of Cleveland Hall you'll find

19 Moot Hall, the building you started from.
