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National Student Exchange

Campuses can work together to develop a program which combines departmental strengths, perspectives, and/or research options. Such programs allow your students to expand the depth and breadth of their education by taking courses at another university in the National Student Exchange network. NSE exchanges are multilateral across member institutions so 1:1 exchanges between departments are not required.

NSE universities have developed academic partnerships, formal and informal, with other members in areas such as fashion and textile technology, landscape architecture, communication, agriculture, forestry, respiratory therapy, athletic training, physics, social work, and hospitality.

NSE can form the basis of an academic relationship among campuses from formal written agreements to casual exchange. NSE will take care of the administrative details; department can take care of the academic arrangements.
