NSE IS A GOOD FIT WITH STUDY ABROAD



One-third of NSE's member campuses administer the National Student Exchange through their study abroad or international programs office.

These offices have discovered that NSE membership expands the scope of their own study away opportunities and appeals to students who may not yet be ready for international experiences but are looking for a change of place. By putting NSE and their own study abroad programs in a single office they are able to:

- market a comprehensive array of exchange opportunities to meet academic and personal goals and objectives
- keep domestic and international campus procedures parallel
- provide comparable levels of support services
- help students, parents and faculty with a one-stop approach to exploring study away opportunities
