## **Additional Degree Requirements**

In addition to the Interior Design major coursework and the general education coursework, all undergraduate degree candidates must meet the following college wide graduation requirements:

- Successful completion of required coursework in the declared major
- Successful completion of 6 credit hours of writing intensive (“W”) courses
- Successful completion of at least 120 hours of which at least 33 must be upper division and 32 must be taken at Buffalo State, including the last 16
- Final overall cumulative average (GPA) of 2.0 or higher
- Final major GPA 2.0 or higher
- Successful completion of all “I”, “N”, or “X” grades.
