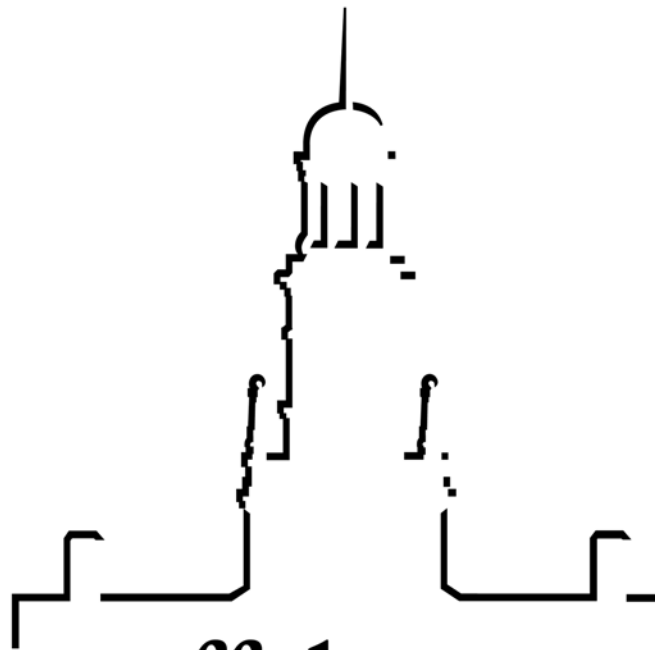

Executive Summary

Enrollment – Fall 2004

- Total enrollment is 11,072. This is a decrease of 85 students (.8%) from the previous fall semester and 731 students (6.2%) from fall 2002.
- Total undergraduate enrollment is 9,008. This is a decrease of 5 students (.06%) from the previous fall semester and a decrease of 487 students (5.1%) from fall 2002.
- Total graduate enrollment is 2,064. This is a decrease of 90 students (4.2%) from the previous fall semester and a decrease of 244 students (10.6%) from fall 2002.
- The All-College Honors program totaled 140 students. This is an increase of 27 students (23.9%) from the previous fall semester.
- Total enrollment of out-of-state students is 115. This is an increase of 14 students (13.9%) from the previous fall semester and an increase of 23 students (25.0%) from fall 2002.
- Total international student enrollment is 80. This is a decrease of 7 students (8.0%) from the previous fall and an increase of 2 students (2.7%) from fall 2002.

Demographics – Fall 2004

- Total enrollment from New York State is 10,831 of which 64.1 percent is from Erie County, 10.9 percent is from Niagara County, 6.9 percent is from the Metro NYC area, and 18.0 percent is from other New York State Counties.
- Sixteen (16) percent of the college's total enrollment is minority students while 14.1 percent underrepresented minorities. This is an increase in percentage from the previous fall minority students (15.0%) and underrepresented minority students (13.7%). EOP accounts for 36.6 percent of the college undergraduate minority student population and 38.5 percent of the college's underrepresented minority student population.
- Graduate minority students enrollment is 184 (8.9%), an increase of 19 students (11.5%) from the previous fall semester and a decrease of 8.5% from fall 2002. Graduate underrepresented minority students enrollment is 169 (8.2%), an increase of 17 students (11.2%) from the previous fall semester and a decrease from fall 2002 (7.1%).

- Women represent 61.5 percent of the total student population. 59.7 percent of our undergraduates are women while 69.2 percent of our graduate students are women.

New Students – Fall 2004

- The mean high school average for general freshmen is 86.0 and the mean SAT Composite score of 1,003. The mean SAT for honors students is 1,176, a decrease of 38 points from the previous fall.
- Since fall 2003, freshmen enrollment decreased by 16 students (1.2 %) to 1,363. Since fall 2003, EOP freshmen enrollment increased by 5 students (2.5%) to 203.
- Since fall 2003, transfer student enrollment increased by 3 students to 1,014.
- Since fall 2003, new graduate enrollment decreased by 53 students (13.0%) to 461.

FTE – Fall 2004

- Total FTE is 9,056. This is an increase of 80 FTE (1.0%) from the previous fall and a decrease of 87 FTE (1.0%) from fall 2002.
- Total undergraduate FTE is 8,121. This is an increase of 67 FTE (0.8%) from the previous fall semester and a decrease of 49 FTE (0.6%) from fall 2002.
- Total graduate FTE is 935. This is an increase of 14 FTE (1.5%) from the previous fall and a decrease of 38 FTE (3.9%) from fall 2002.

Undergraduate and Graduate Admissions – Fall 2004

- Undergraduate freshman applications increased by 808 (10.4%). The number of acceptances increased by 287 (6.9%). The acceptance yield to enrollment ratio was 30.9%, a decrease of 2.5%.
- Sixty-six (66.0) percent of all freshman applicants either withdrew or became inactive, an increase of 1.0 percent from fall 2003. Sixty-nine (69.0) percent of all freshman acceptances either withdrew or became inactive, an increase of 5.0%.

- Undergraduate transfer applications increased by 111 (4.1%). The number of acceptances decreased by 10 (0.6%). The acceptance yield to enrollment ratio was 62.4%, an increase of 0.6%.
- Forty-eight (48.2) percent of all transfer applicants either withdrew or became inactive, an increase of 3.9 percent from fall 2003. Twenty-nine (29.4) percent of all transfer acceptances either withdrew or became inactive, same as fall 2003.
- New graduate applications increased by 73 (8.2%). The number of acceptances increased by 123 (16.6%). The acceptance yield to enrollment ratio was 53.3%, a decrease of 1.7%.

Special Admit Students – Fall 2004

- Total EOP enrollment is 852, an increase of 23 students (2.8%) from previous fall. EOP students are 9.5 percent of our total undergraduate population. 76.3 percent are minority students while 72.5 percent are underrepresented minority students. Total EOP first-time enrollment is 203 and is 15.4 percent of our first-time full-time degree-seeking freshmen population.
- Total S.T.A.R. enrollment is 730, a decrease of 56 students (7.1%) from previous fall. S.T.A.R. is 8.1 percent of our total undergraduate population. 16.8 percent are minority students while 14.8 percent are underrepresented minority students. Total S.T.A.R. first-time enrollment is 164 and is 12.5 percent of our first-time full-time degree-seeking freshmen population. First-time S.T.A.R. enrollment decreased by 33.6 percent from previous fall semester.

Faculty of Arts and Humanities

- Total enrollment is 2,270, an increase of 34 students (1.5%) from previous fall. Undergraduate enrollment (1,991) increased by 37 students (1.9%) while graduate enrollment (279) decreased by 3 students (1.1%) from fall 2003.

Faculty of Applied Science and Education

- Total enrollment is 4,678, a decrease of 102 students (2.1%) from previous fall. Undergraduate enrollment (3,426) increased by 34 students (1.0%) while graduate enrollment (1,252) decreased by 136 students (9.8%) from fall 2003.

Faculty of Natural and Social Sciences

- Total enrollment is 2,371, an increase of 165 students (7.5%) from previous fall. Undergraduate enrollment (2,081) increased by 128 students

(6.6%) while graduate enrollment (290) increased by 37 students (14.6%) from fall 2003.

Glossary

Continuing Students

Undergraduate – an undergraduate student registered in the current term who was enrolled at Buffalo State during the previous term. In the case of the Fall term, “previous term” shall mean either the previous Summer or Spring term; e.g., those undergraduate students in the Fall 2004 who were enrolled at Buffalo State during Summer 2004 or Spring 2004 are continuing students.

Graduate – a graduate student registered in the current term who was enrolled at Buffalo State as a Graduate Student during the previous term. In the case of the Fall term, “previous term” shall mean either the previous Summer or Spring term; e.g., those graduate students in the Fall 2004 who were enrolled at Buffalo State during Summer 2004 or Spring 2004 are continuing students.

FTE

Full-time Equivalent Workload is a unit of measure usually derived from student credit hours. One FTE workload is equivalent to 15 student credit hours in undergraduate courses, or 12 student credit hours in graduate courses. Certificate of Advance Study are calculated as follows: One FTE for full-time Advance Graduate Students, 0.75 FTE for part-time Advance Graduate Students.

Matriculated

A student enrolled at the Buffalo State and is considered by the institution to be currently pursuing a specific type of degree (such as bachelors, masters, etc...) and who has or has not yet chosen a major field of study.

Non-Matriculated

A student enrolled at Buffalo State to take certain credit courses and is not considered by the institution to be currently pursuing a specific type of degree (such as bachelors, masters, etc...).

New Students

Freshman

A student who has not been previously enrolled at any college or university and who is enrolled for the first time at Buffalo State this term. A student whose previous post-secondary education was only at a non-collegiate institution such as a business school or technical institute is a first-time student, unless Buffalo State expects to give college credit for such activities in which case the student is a transfer student.

Transfer

An undergraduate student who is enrolled at your institution for the first time in the current term, but who has attended other colleges or universities prior to the current term. The actual number of credit hours he/she is allowed to transfer is not relevant to the distinction between a transfer and a first-time student, even if no credits were ultimately transferable.

Graduate

A graduate student, whose first enrollment as a graduate student at your institution, occurs during the current term.

Returning Students

Undergraduate – an undergraduate student registered in the current term who has been enrolled at Buffalo State but was **not** enrolled in the previous term. In the case of the Fall term, “previous term” shall include both the previous Summer or Spring term; e.g., an undergraduate student in the Fall 2004 is a returning student if he/she was previously enrolled at Buffalo State but in neither the Spring 2004 nor Summer 2004 terms.

Graduate – a graduate student registered in the current term who has been enrolled at Buffalo State as a GRADUATE student but was **not** enrolled as a GRADUATE student in the previous term. In the case of the Fall term, “previous term” shall include both the previous Summer or Spring term; e.g., a graduate student in the Fall 2004 is a returning student, if he/she was previously enrolled as a GRADUATE student at Buffalo State but in neither the Spring 2004 nor Summer 2004 terms.

Underrepresented Minority Students

include African-American, Hispanic, and Native-American.
