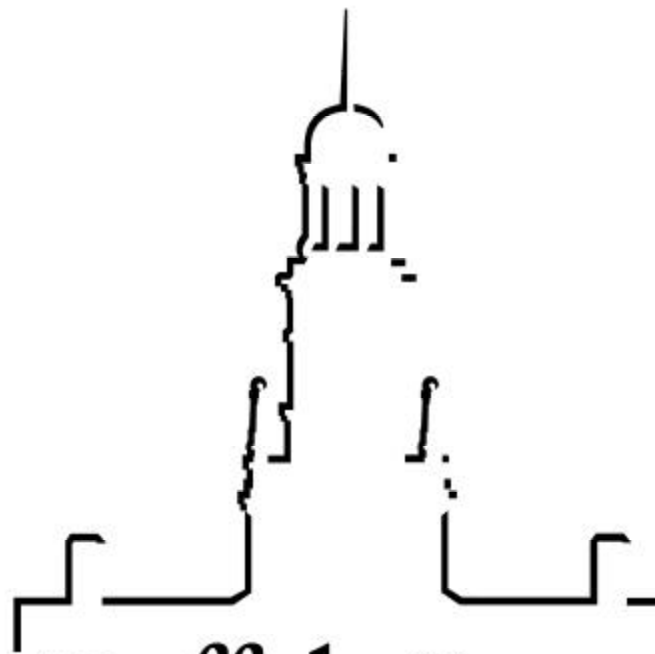

Executive Summary

Enrollment – Fall 2001

- ?? Total enrollment for fall 2001 is 11,743. This represents an increase of 343 students (3.0%) from the previous fall semester and 237 students (2.1%) from fall 1999.
- ?? Total undergraduate enrollment is 9,590. This represents an increase of 204 students (2.2%) from the previous fall semester and 134 students (1.5%) from fall 1999.
- ?? Total graduate enrollment is 2,153. This represents an increase of 140 students (7.0%) from previous fall semester and 103 students (5.4%) from fall 1999.
- ?? Total enrollment for honor program for fall 2001 is 113. This is an increase of 11 students (10.7%) from the previous fall semester and 10 students (10.9%) from fall 1999.

New Students – Fall 2001

- ?? The fall 2001 freshman class is the largest since 1991. The mean high school averages for freshmen has increased to 85.2. The mean SAT for honors students is up 27 points.
- ?? Since fall 2000, freshmen enrollment increased by 63 students (4.7%) to 1,413.
- ?? Since fall 2000, transfer student enrollment decreased by 70 students (6.3%) to 1,047.
- ?? Since fall 2000, new graduate enrollment decreased by 51 students (10.5%) to 433.

FTE – Fall 2001

- ?? Total FTE for fall 2001 is 9,038. This is an increase of 364 FTE (4.2%) from the previous fall.
- ?? Total undergraduate FTE is 8,142. This is an increase of 308 FTE (3.9%) from the previous fall semester.
- ?? Total graduate FTE is 895. This is an increase of 55 (6.5%) FTE from the previous fall.

Undergraduate and Graduate Admissions – Fall 2001

- ?? This fall semester, undergraduate freshman applications increased by 257 applicants (3.7%). The number of accepts decreased by 30 applicants (1.0%). The acceptance yield to enroll was 34.5%, an increase of 1.7%. The previous fall semester yield was 32.8%.

- ?? This fall semester, undergraduate transfer applications increased by 147 applicants (5.8%). The number of accepts decreased by 99 applicants (5.6%). The acceptance yield to enroll was 62.2%, a decrease of 0.4%. The previous fall semester yield was 62.6%.

- ?? This fall semester, new graduate applications decreased by 57 applicants (6.4%). The number of accepts decreased by 63 applicants (8.9%). The acceptance yield to enroll was 67.3, a decrease of 1.3%. The previous fall semester yield was 68.6%.

This is a comparison of official fall 2000 enrollment data to fall 2001 official file.

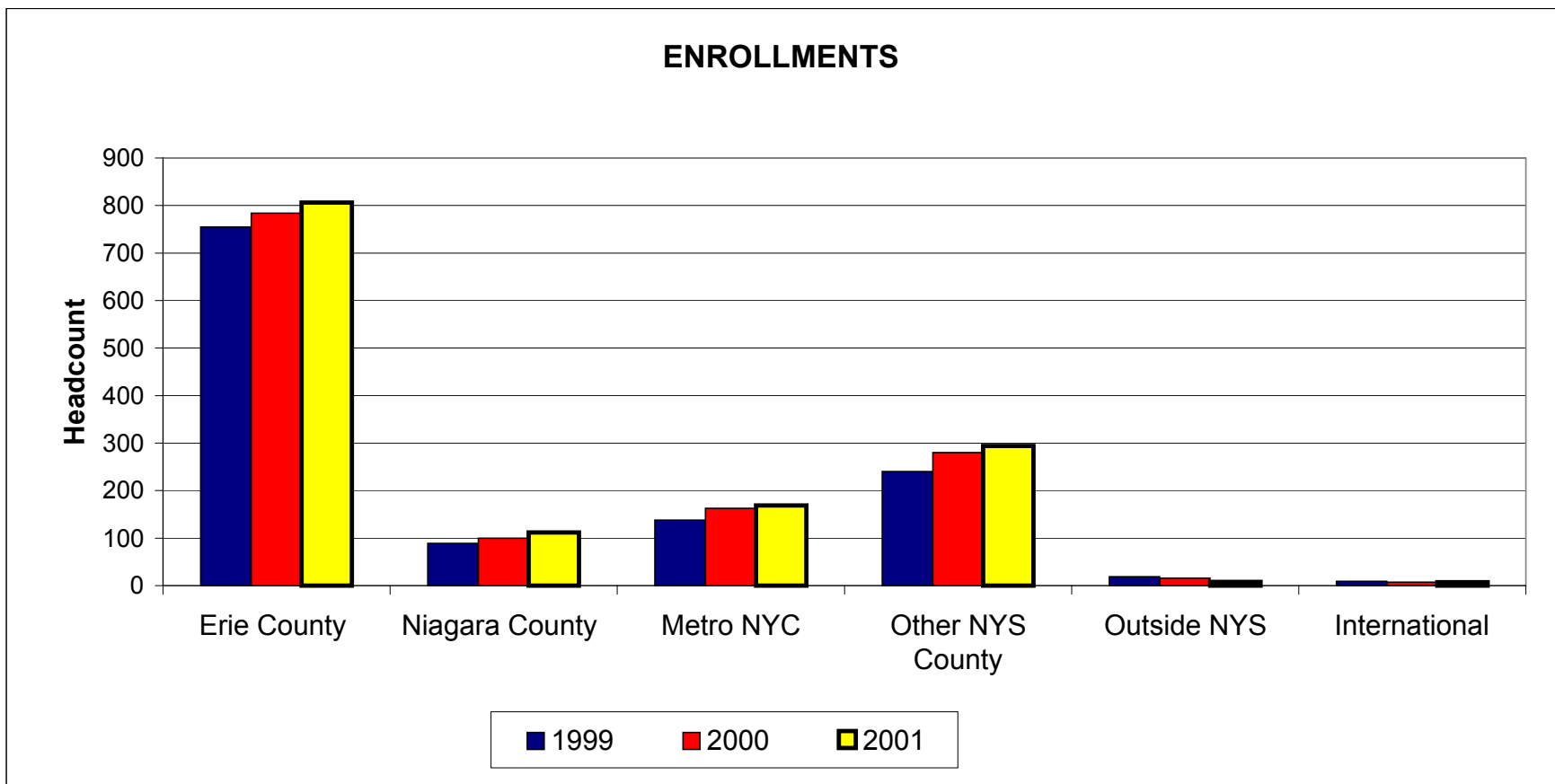
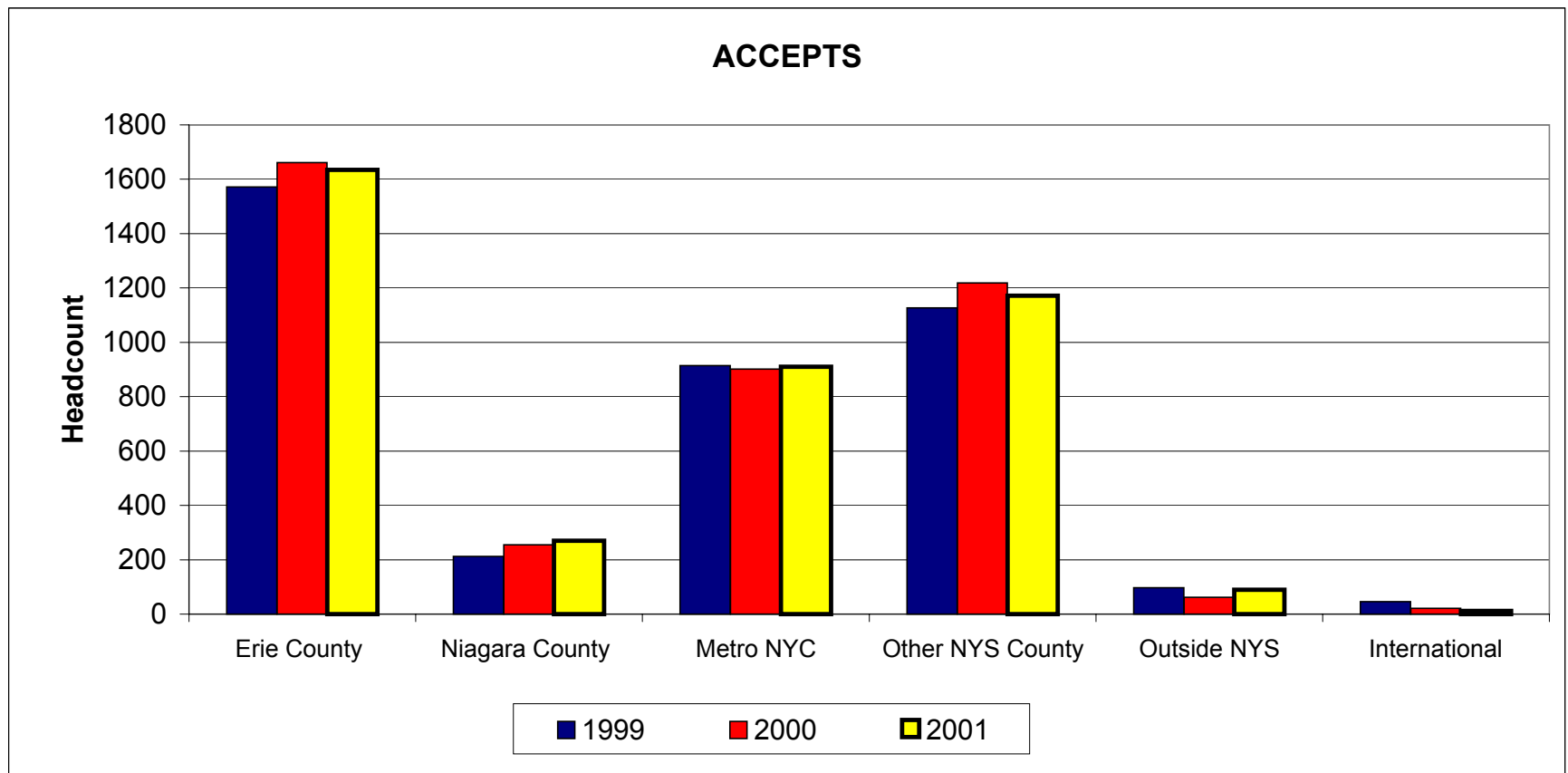
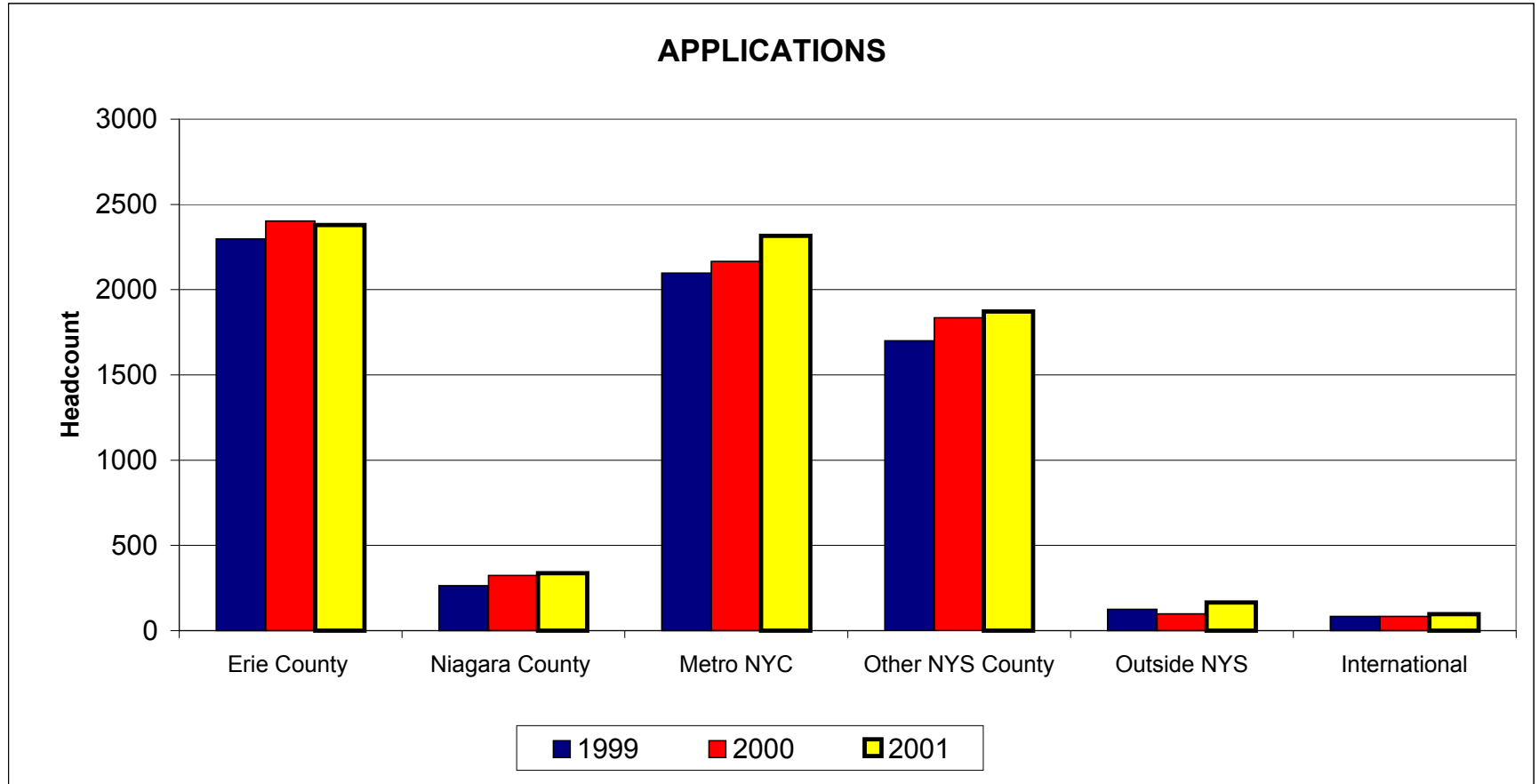

FALL 1999 THRU FALL 2001



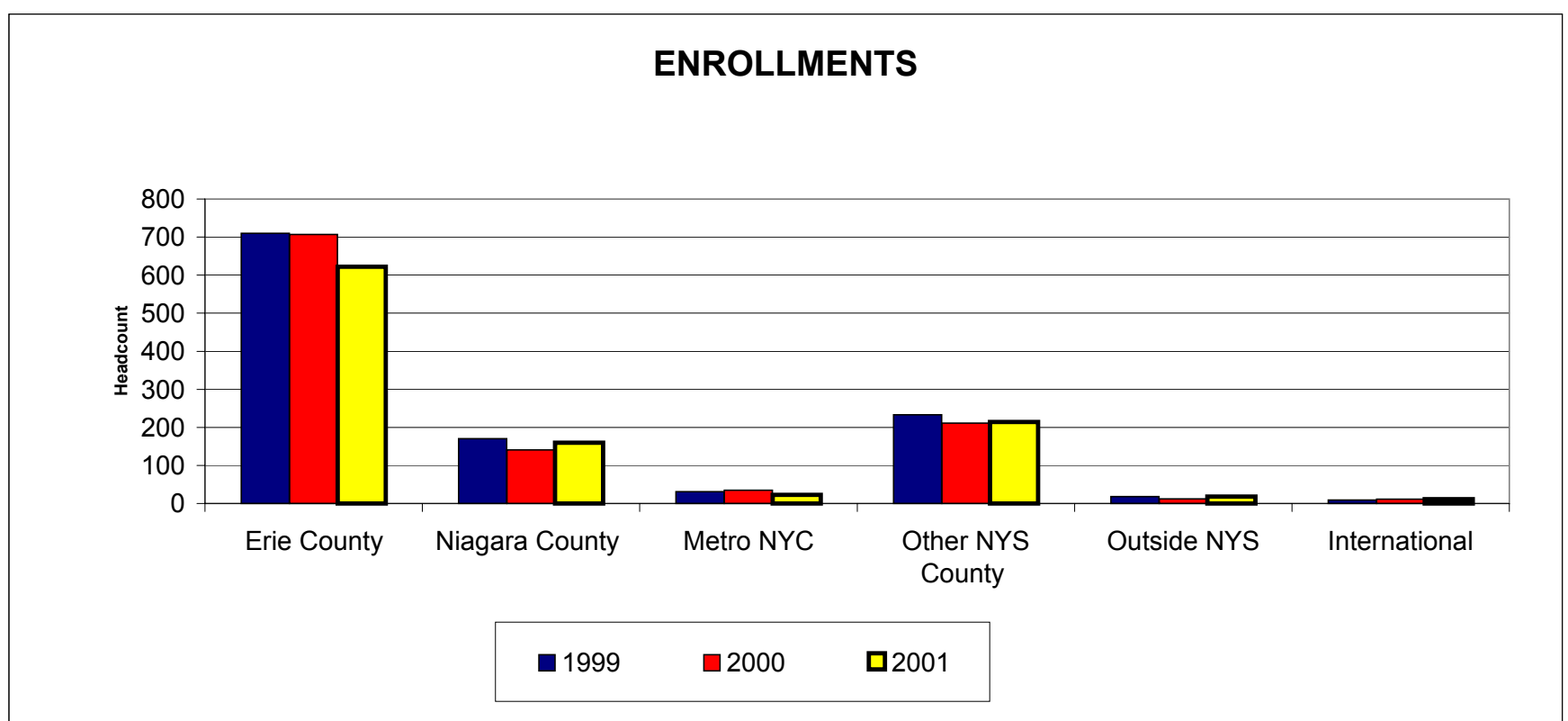
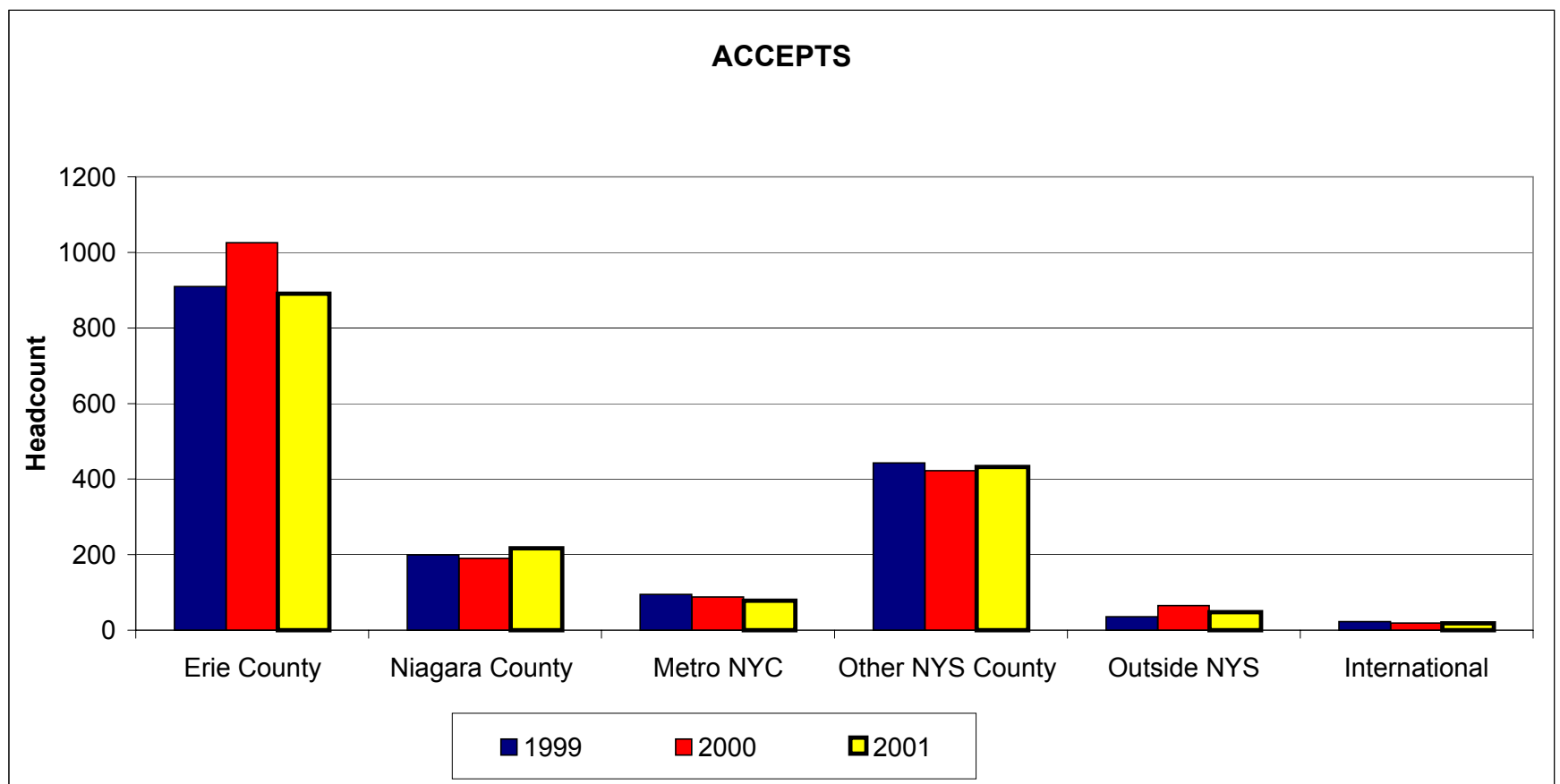
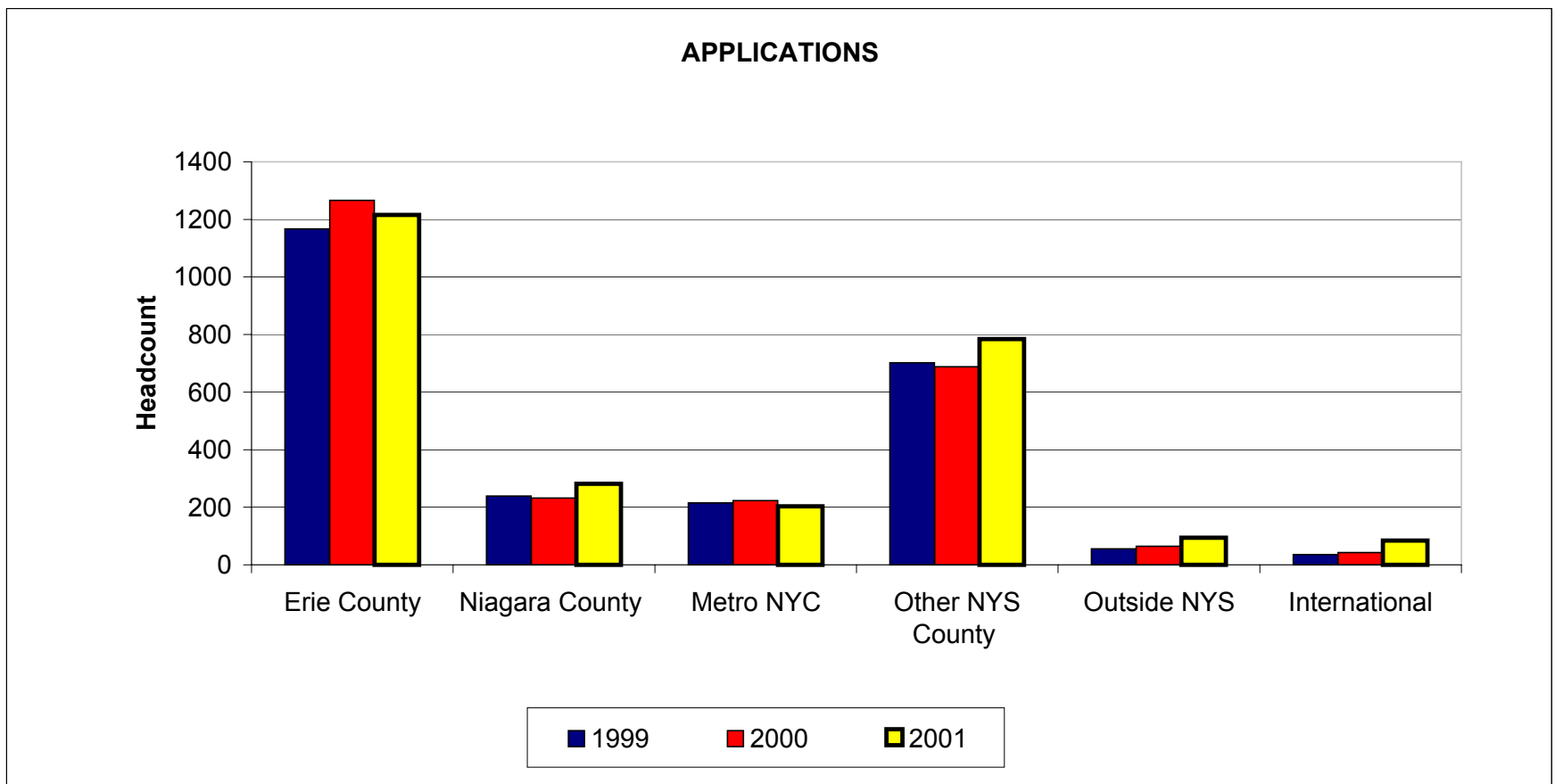

FALL 1999 THRU FALL 2001



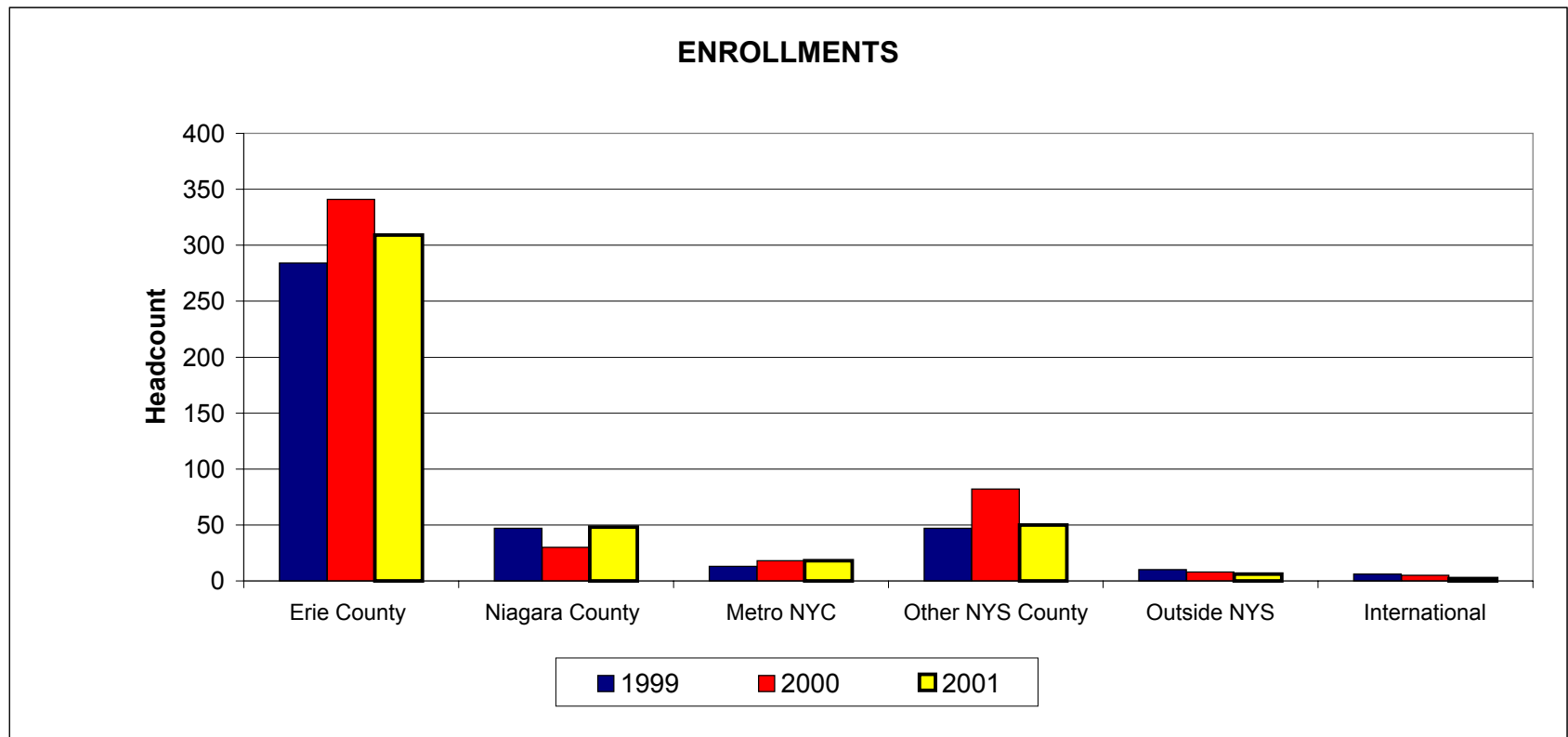
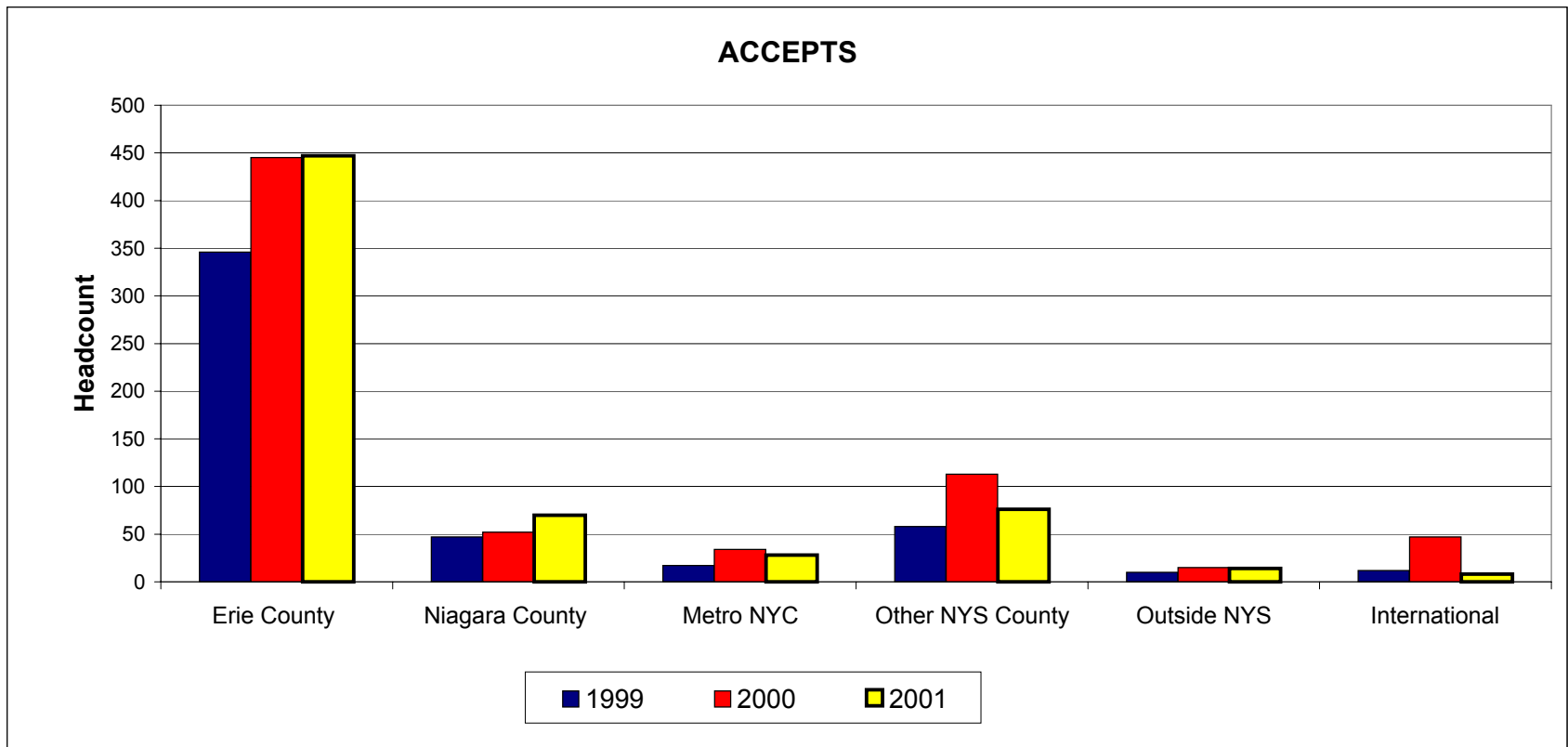
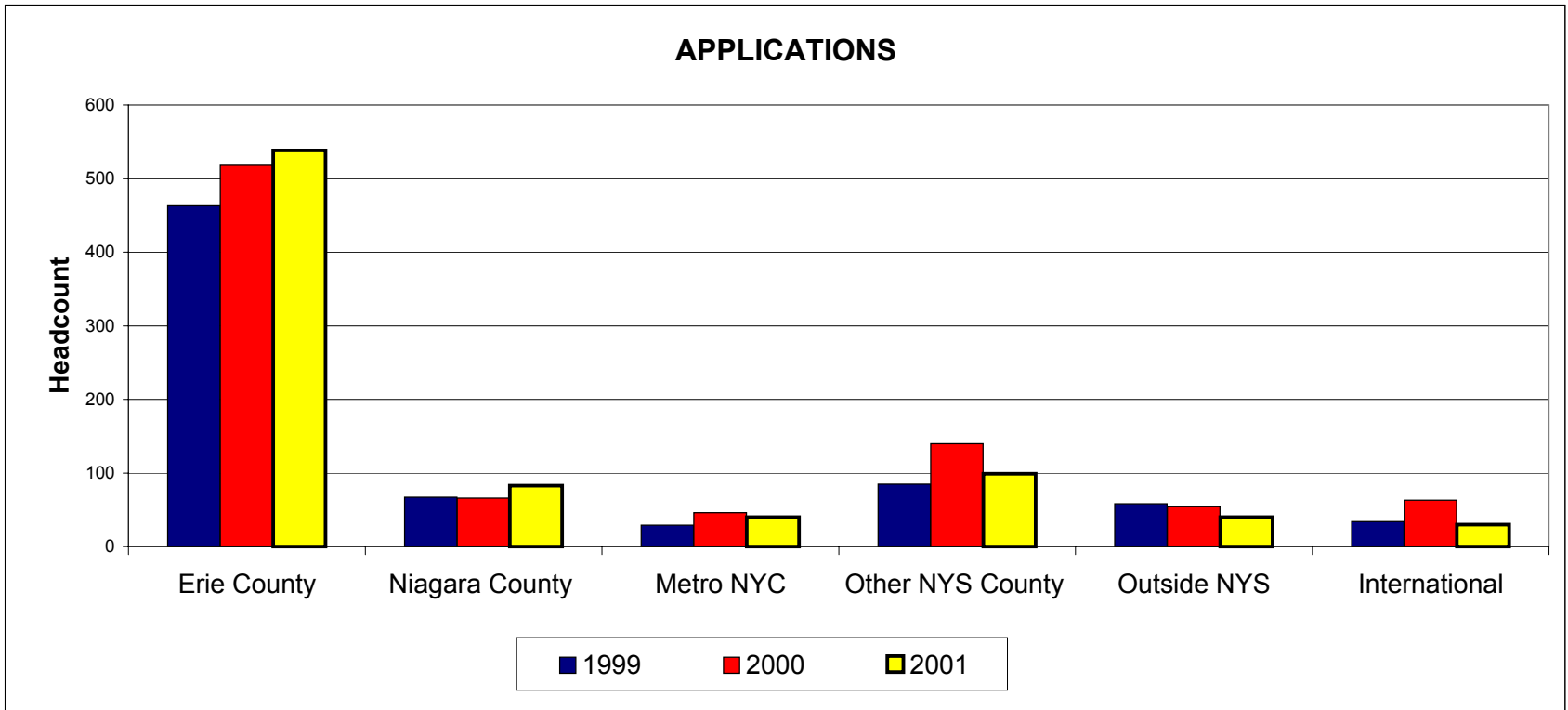

Glossary

Continuing Students

Undergraduate – an undergraduate student registered in the current term who was enrolled at BUFFALO STATE during the previous term. In the case of the Fall term, “previous term” shall mean either the previous Summer or Spring term; e.g., those undergraduate students in the Fall 2001 who were enrolled at BUFFALO STATE during Summer 2001 or Spring 2001 are continuing students.

Graduate – a graduate student registered in the current term who was enrolled at BUFFALO STATE as a GRADUATE STUDENT during the previous term. In the case of the Fall term, “previous term” shall mean either the previous Summer or Spring term; e.g., those graduate students in the Fall 2001 who were enrolled at BUFFALO STATE during Summer 2001 or Spring 2001 are continuing students.

FTE

Full-time Equivalent Workload is a unit of measure usually derived from student credit hours. One FTE workload is equivalent to 15 student credit hours in undergraduate courses, or 12 student credit hours in graduate courses. Certificate of Advance Study are calculated as follows: One FTE for full-time Advance Graduate Students, 0.75 FTE for part-time Advance Graduate Students.

Matriculated

A student enrolled at the Buffalo State and is considered by the institution to be currently pursuing a specific type of degree (such as bachelors, masters, etc...) and who has or has not yet chosen a major field of study.

Non-Matriculated

A student enrolled at Buffalo State to take certain credit courses and is not considered by the institution to be currently pursuing a specific type of degree (such as bachelors, masters, etc...).

New Students

Freshman

A student who has not been previously enrolled at any college or university and who is enrolled for the first time at BUFFALO STATE this term. A student whose previous post-secondary education was only at a non collegiate institution such as a business school or technical institute is a first-time student, unless BUFFALO STATE expects to give college credit for such activities in which case the student is a transfer student.

Transfer

An undergraduate student who is enrolled at your institution for the first time in the current term, but who has attended other colleges or universities prior to the current term. The actual number of credit hours he/she is allowed to transfer is not relevant to the distinction between a transfer and a first-time student, even if no credits were ultimately transferable.

Graduate

A graduate student, whose first enrollment as a graduate student at your institution, occurs during the current term.

Returning Students

Undergraduate – an undergraduate student registered in the current term who has been enrolled at BUFFALO STATE but was **not** enrolled in the previous term. In the case of the Fall term, “previous term” shall include both the previous Summer or Spring term; e.g., an undergraduate student in the Fall 2001 is a returning student if he/she was previously enrolled at BUFFALO STATE but in neither the Spring 2001 nor Summer 2001 terms.

Graduate – a graduate student registered in the current term who has been enrolled at BUFFALO STATE as a GRADUATE student but was **not** enrolled as a GRADUATE student in the previous term. In the case of the Fall term, “previous term” shall include both the previous Summer or Spring term; e.g., a graduate student in the Fall 2001 is a returning student, if he/she was previously enrolled as a GRADUATE student at BUFFALO STATE but in neither the Spring 2001 nor Summer 2001 terms.

Underrepresented Minority Students

include African-American, Hispanic, and Native-American.
