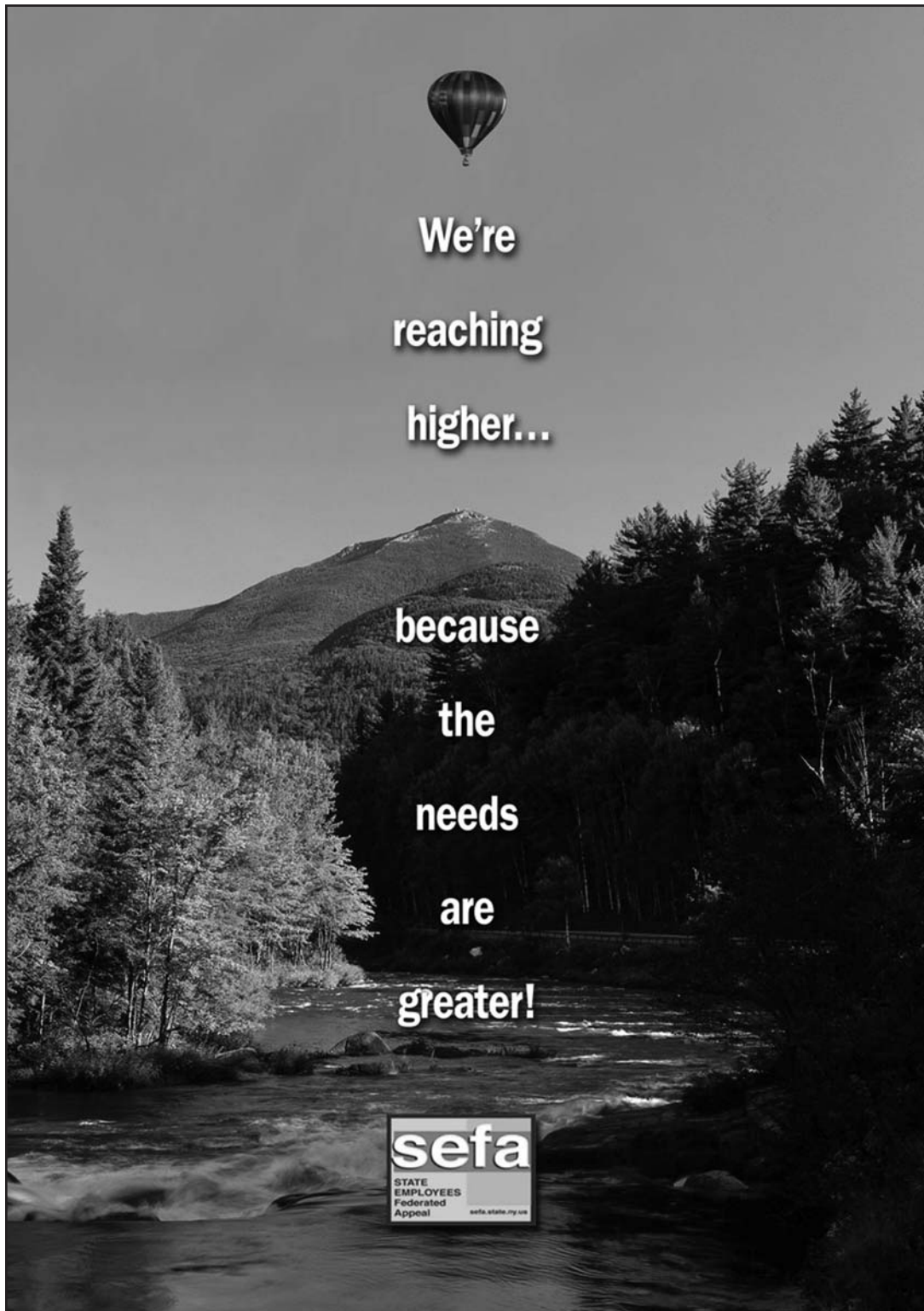

**The Niagara Frontier SEFA Steering Committee
encourages you to designate your gift to the charity of your choice**

Under the new SEFA Regulations, section 335.10.b requires that undesignated gifts be distributed to charities according to the following formula:

“In all campaign areas, undesignated contributions and pledges to the campaign shall be distributed in accordance with the following steps:

(1) The percentage of the total amount of contributions and pledges to the campaign that were designated to each specific participating organization shall be computed.

(2) Each participating charity shall be allotted the same percentage of total undesignated funds as it received as designated funds, minus only the deduction for the SEFA campaign’s administrative costs.”

For example, if Charity “A” receives 1.2% of the total designated dollars, it will receive 1.2% of the total undesignated dollars.

SEFA regulation 335.6(b)(2)(ii) gives the following guidelines for calculating administrative percentages from the IRS form 990:

“This percentage shall be computed from information on the IRS Form 990 by adding the amount spent on “management and general” (line 14) to “fundraising” (line 15) and then dividing the sum by “total revenue” (line 12).”

Charities are required by law to make their 990 available to the public. Copies of a charity’s 990 may be obtained by contacting the charities directly, or found on the internet, at sites such as:

WHAT IS SEFA?

SEFA is a single combined campaign for employees of New York State, supported by labor management. The SEFA campaign will be the only time State employees are asked to give at the worksite during the entire year.

SEFA brings together United Way agencies, independent agencies, Global Impact agencies, Earth Share of New York agencies, Independent Charities of America agencies, Community Health Charities of New York agencies, America's Charities agencies, Share America agencies and Community Works of New York agencies.



WHY PAYROLL DEDUCTION

Making a pledge in bi-weekly installments through the SEFA Payroll Deduction Plan allows you to be more generous than may be possible if you had to give a one-time cash gift. Payroll deduction will begin January 1, 2008 and end December 31, 2008. In the event you change positions, you will need to contact Audit and Control to continue your pledge. Payroll pledges to SEFA may be cancelled anytime during the year by contacting your payroll office.



DESIGNATING YOUR PLEDGE

You have the opportunity to designate all or a portion of your gift to a specific agency or federation listed in the SEFA brochure. Designations to agencies or federations are encouraged and will be honored first.

Important Change in State Regulations:

State regulations require the undesignated funds be allocated to participating agencies and federations on a prorated basis according to the percentage of designated funds, i.e. if agency Y gets 10% of the designated funds they will get 10% of the undesignated funds.

Only agencies and federations receiving funds through designations will receive a portion of the undesignated funds.



CAMPAIGN COSTS

The local SEFA Committee will use a small portion of your SEFA contribution to cover campaign costs as outlined in the budget approved. These costs are kept to minimum levels because of the voluntary nature of the campaign



BENEFITS OF SEFA

- One annual federated campaign to provide funds year-round to many health and human services agencies in the Niagara Frontier, nationwide, and worldwide.
- Opportunity to give through payroll deduction to all the agencies affiliated with the campaign.
- Knowledge that SEFA is your campaign and is so identified on all campaign materials.
- Identity in the community as the State employees commitment to support health and human services.
- A concept of federated funding endorsed by the State administration.
- More of your dollar reaches the services because of the consolidated approach to fund-raising.



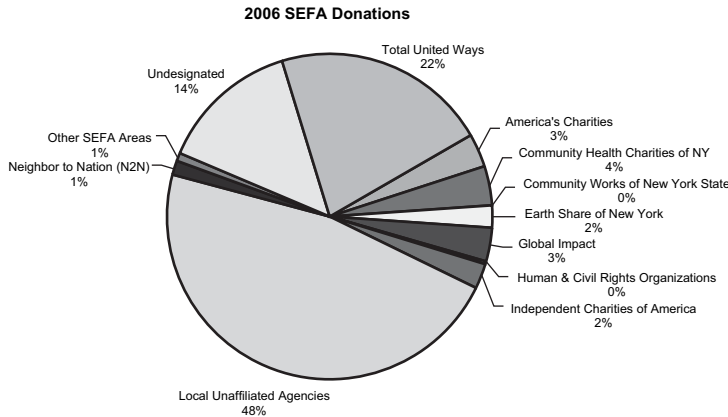
